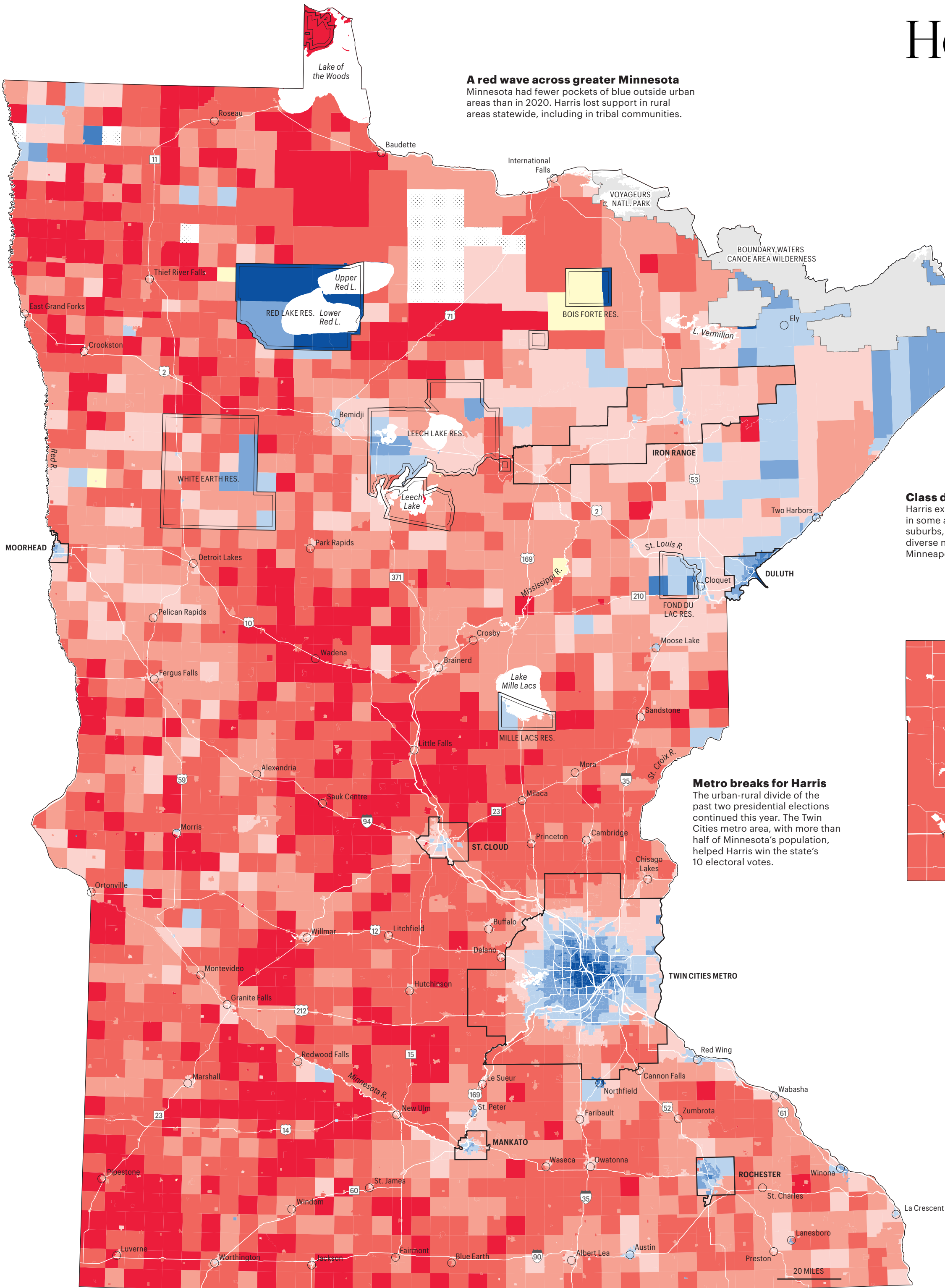

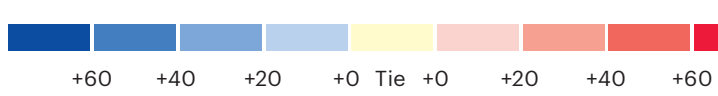
# How your neighborhood voted in 2024

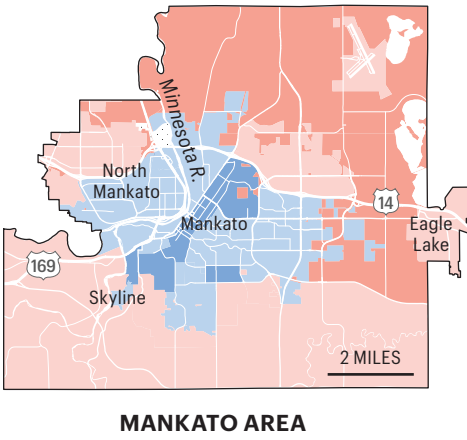
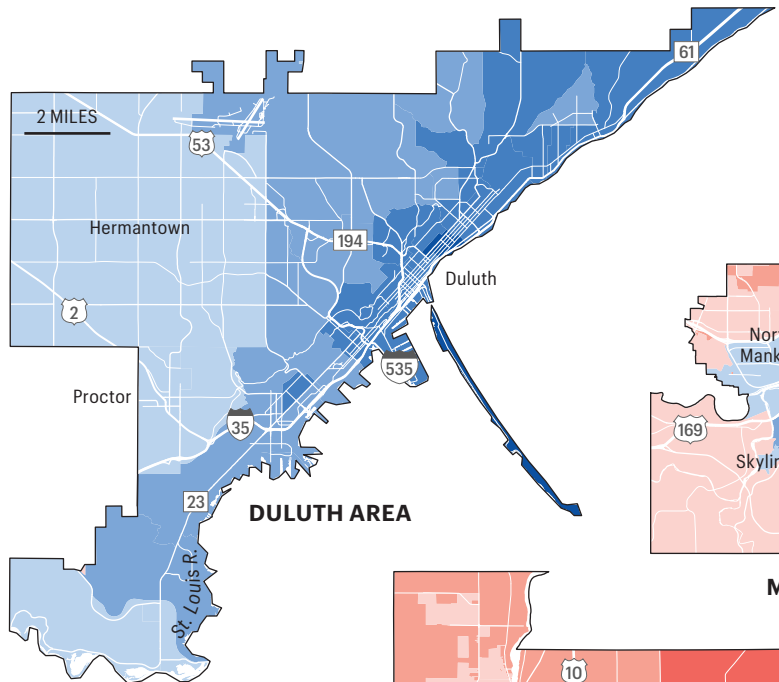
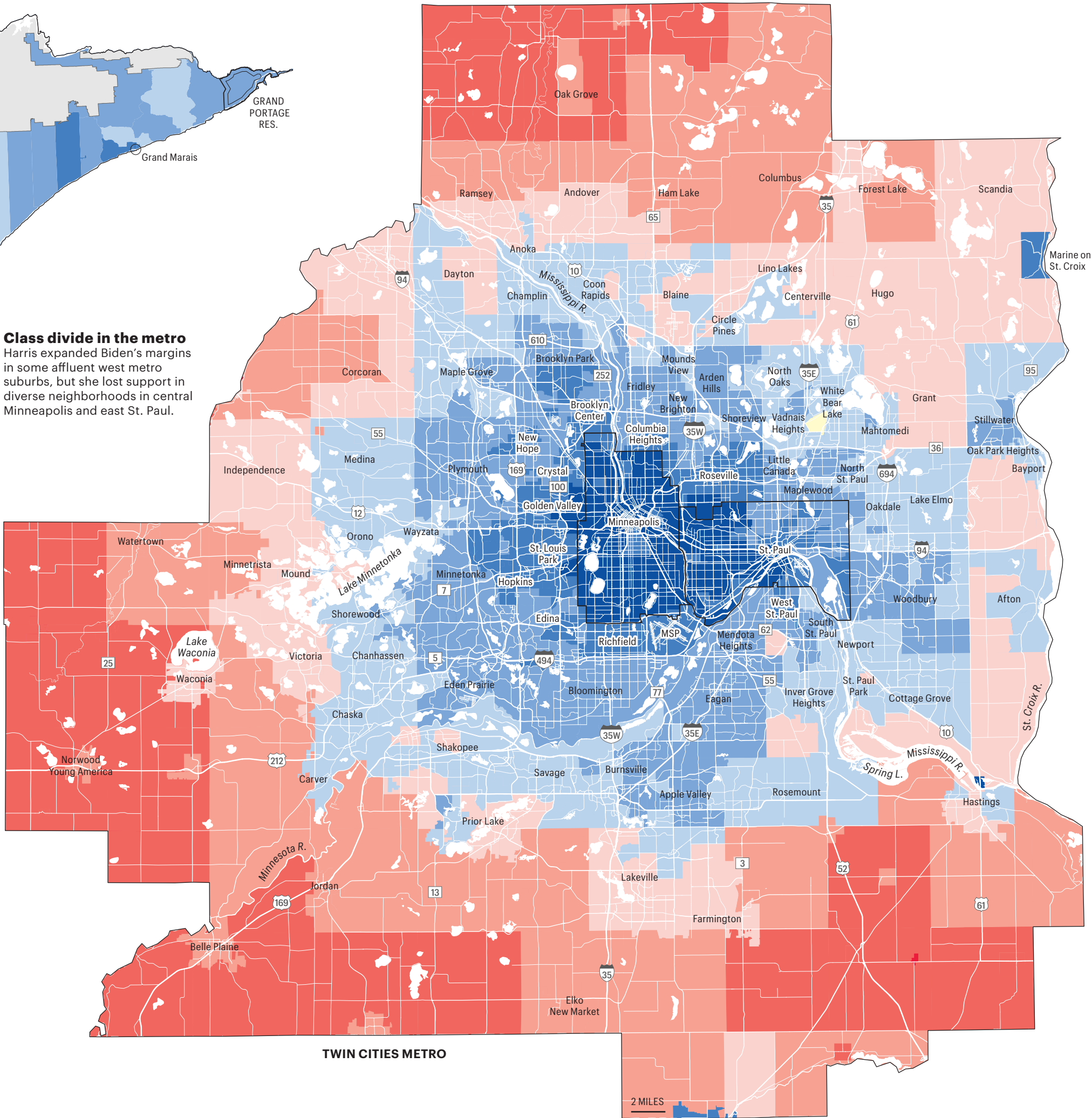

Minnesota continued its decades-long streak of backing Democratic presidential candidates, but Trump won a greater share of Minnesota's vote than in either of the past two elections. A detailed look at Minnesota's voting data reveals a polarized state that shifted to the right.

**Class divide in the metro**

Harris expanded Biden's margins in some affluent west metro suburbs, but she lost support in diverse neighborhoods in central Minneapolis and east St. Paul.



**Political transformation on the Range**

Once a bastion of working-class union Democrats, the Iron Range largely completed its transformation into Trump country, with the president-elect winning mining towns that backed Biden such as Virginia, Hibbing and Biwabik.

**Small cities swing right**

Trump erased Biden's gains in smaller cities such as St. Cloud, Moorhead and Mankato, home to vice presidential hopeful Tim Walz. Duluth and Rochester remained Democratic strongholds.
